SumMATT Program Guide

SumMATT 2022

This 4-8 week summer program is designed to give people hands-on experience overseas and is structured intentionally to help people begin learning skills that would translate to a long term (2 years or more) mission assignment. In no particular order, the summer program goals are:

- 1. LEARN THE LANGUAGE: Students will be enrolled in Spanish language classes, and/or tutors would be hired to teach Spanish. Between formal classes and tutoring, Spanish language acquisition should take place on a daily basis.
- 2. LEARN THE CULTURE: This will be done through a combination of cultural experiences. Students will be living in a Dominican home and expected to play an active role in that home by learning how to cook Dominican food, participating in family events, maybe even attending a Dominican wedding, etc. Participants will also get the chance to see the historical old city in Santo Domingo and other cultural sites. We think it's important for students to practice the skill of entering into a new culture as a learner.
- 3. BE DISCIPLED: Students will be discipled by their leaders in the Dominican Republic. They will also have discipleship material to take with them and have a regular phone call from a coach/mentor in the United States.

4. MISSION/CHURCH WORK:

- Participants are required to participate in the ministry that the church is doing.
 For example, evangelism, discipleship, bible studies, attending church on Sundays and participating in other church events etc.
- b. In addition to that, service opportunities will be created ahead of time based on the participants experience and interests. Be creative! For example, we had a student who was trained in self defense and taught a class on that during his time. Other examples include teaching English as a second language, vacation bible school or sports ministry.
- c. Everyone would be expected to help out if/when a team from the States comes to serve for a week. The short term trip would be consistent with the goals of SumMATT and the vision of Operation MATT, which is to plant churches.

WHO COULD GO?

Students or other mission-minded young adults 18-26 years old who have been on at least one week-long mission trip, preferably to a foreign country.

WHERE WOULD THEY LIVE?

Participants would live in a host home and would be housed at least two of the same sex in each home.

HOW WOULD THEY GET AROUND?

Participants would learn to use the public transportation system, but never travelling alone. They can use cars, a rented minivan, or the excellent intercity bus system for out of town trips/cultural experiences.

WHO WOULD OVERSEE THE STUDENTS/PROGRAM?

Pedro Juan Gonzales' who is the pastor of Santiago Baptist Church and also has a background as a medical doctor would be primarily responsible for the day in day out activities of the students. This includes schedules, money distribution, host home experience, meals, Spanish language learning, cultural experiences, accompanying students to all missions/ministry responsibilities, discipleship, missions and church involvement as well as handling any emergencies, etc.

COST

A budget will be put together that will include all of the anticipated necessary expenses that the participants are expected to incur. Students would have to raise their own support of \$2,500-\$3,500 depending on duration.

This fee will to cover:

- Airfare
- Housing (2 to a room) in Host home
- Food and cooking in Host home
- Transportation (to and from ministry activities)
- Spending Allowance (\$100 per week)
- Formal Spanish Classes and Tutoring
- Trip Insurance

TRIP PLANNING

In the Dominican Republic, our staff will...

- Establish Spanish Classes and hire tutors for each student
- Set up a list of cultural experiences
- Create mission service opportunities
- Set up a list of church volunteer needs
- Establish (and monitor) host homes
- Create schedules for the participants
- Oversee Health and Safety Practices

In the USA, our staff will...

- Recruit and Review Applicants
- Orient & Train participants
- Purchase airline tickets
- Accompany the participants to the DR for first few days
